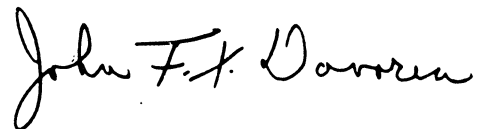

- B. It will develop and administer an area plan on aging which is designed to develop comprehensive and coordinated programs for older persons throughout said Area III, and which will conform to the provision: of Part 903.78 and Part 903.79 of Title 45 of the Federal Regulations and will further conform to state regulations and to the pertinent policies and procedures of the Massachusetts Department of Elder Affairs. This area plan will provide for services through contracts with and/or grants to service providers within said Area III.
- C. Determining the need for social services for the elderly in Area III, and special attention be paid to the needs of low-income minority elderly.
- D. Surveying the resources available to meet the needs of older persons in Area III, and evaluating the effectiveness of services being provided.
- E. Promoting cooperation among agencies serving the elderly.
 - 1. To buy sell, lease, and mortgage or otherwise acquire and dispose of real estate and personal property.

The Corporation is hereby authorized to apply for grants; receive funds from the cities and towns in Area III, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, from the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare under the Older Americans Act, or any other Federal Law which authorizes the expenditure of funds for services; and to Administer allotted funds from said public and private sources with a major portion of the funds to come from government sources. The Corporation is authorized to assist Older Americans with hot meals, nutrition, medical services, legal services, or any other services which will prolong the life and well being of Older Americans.

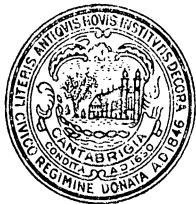
Said organization shall employ the personnel necessary to deliver the aforementioned services, and shall have the power to contract for such services with other private as well as public institutions. However, these purposes shall expressly exclude the provider to become the licensee of any institution which requires a license by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

AREA III, AREA AGENCY ON AGING, INCORPORATED

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

- A. This non-profit corporation is organized to provide leadership and advocacy of all older persons 60 years of age or over in Area III (Regions III, IV, V.) which shall consist of the following cities and towns:
- a) Region III; Belmont, Waltham, Watertown, Acton, Bedford, Boxborough, Carlisle, Concord, Harvard, Lincoln, Littleton, Maynard, Stow, Arlington, Burlington, Lexington, Wilmington, Winchester, Woburn, Cambridge, Somerville
 - b) Region IV; Beverly, Danvers, Essex, Gloucester, Hamilton, Ipswich, Manchester, Marblehead, Middleton, Peabody, Rockport, Salem, Topsfield, Wenham, Lynn, Lynnfield, Nahant, Saugus, Swampscott, Everett, Malden, Medford, Melrose, North Reading, Reading, Stoneham, Wakefield.
 - c) Region V; Ashland, Dover, Framingham, Holliston, Hopkinton, Hudson, Marlborough, Millis, Natick, Northborough, Sherborn, Southborough, Sudbury, Wayland, Westborough, Cantor, Dedham, Medfield, Needham, Norfolk, Norwood, Plainville, Sharon, Walpole, Westwoos, Wrentham, Newton, Wellesley, Weston, Braintree, Cohasset, Hingham, Hull, Milton, Quincy, Randolph, Scituate, Weymouth, Brookline, Foxborough, Holbrook, and any new cities and towns as may be added in the future in said area.

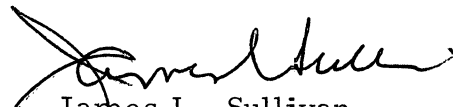
