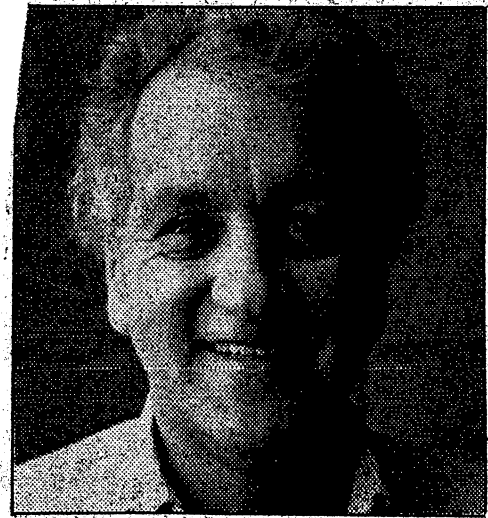

Educator at Rindge and Latin

Anthony Carnabuci of Wilmington, executive director of the School of Technical Arts at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, died of lung cancer Monday in Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 59.

Mr. Carnabuci was born in Boston. He graduated from Fitchburg State College and earned a master's degree in education at the University of Massachusetts in Boston.
