- WHEREAS: This week we have an opportunity to recognize a group of public employees whose work we often take for granted. This week is National Public Works Week. Our chance to salute the people who manage Cambridge's water, sewer, parks, street, public transportation, and refuse collection systems. Thanks for a job well done.
- WHEREAS: public works services provided in our community are an integral part of our citizens' everyday lives; and
- WHEREAS: the support of an understanding and informed citizenry is vital to the efficient operation of public works systems and programs such as water, sewers, streets and highways, public buildings, solid waste collection and snow removal; and
- WHEREAS: the health, safety and comfort of this community greatly depends on these facilities and services; and
- WHEREAS: the quality and effectiveness of these facilities, as well as their planning, design and construction, is vitally dependent upon the efforts and skill of public works officials; and
- WHEREAS: the efficiency of the qualified and dedicated personnel who staff public works departments is materially influenced by the people's attitude and understanding of the importance of the work they perform; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council does, by this resolution, proclaim May 20-26, 1979 as NATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS WEEK in Cambridge and call upon all citizens and civic organizations to acquaint themselves with the problems involved in providing our public works and to recognize the contributions which public works officials make every day to our health, safety and comfort.
