To the Honorable

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge -

We, the undersigned abutters and residents on
Brattle St. have reason to believe that a number
of the residents on the Street would by subscription
pay for and lay down a plank sidewalk on the North
side of Brattle St. from Brattle Square (where the
brick sidewalk ends) to Craigie St.:

We have also reason to believe that such a side-
walk would be acceptable to all the residents, pro-
vided it is so made that it can be taken up
every Spring and put down again every Autumn
and that it be made of two inch plank and not

less than four feet wide:

We therefore petition your Honorable Board that after the sidewalk is over laid, it be accepted by the City which will take charge of it and light and re-lay it in Spring and Autumn.
