Please be advised that upon receipt of a copy of this order, the Project Office undertook an effort to comply with the request for eradication of rodents.

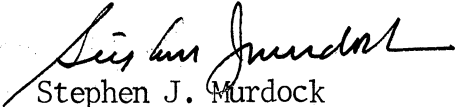
During the period of March 1, 1982, through March 24, 1982, a total of sixty-one (61) houses had been treated by a professional exterminator for the eradication of rodents at the Authority's expense.

Further, there have been sporadic incidents reported to the Project Office and these have been treated within twenty-four (24) hours of the complaint.

It is felt that the MBTA has cooperated fully with the City of Cambridge in alleviating a bothersome problem.

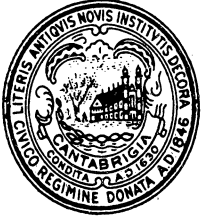
