WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of **Charles J. Moos** on September 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS: Charles Moos moved here from New York City in 1990 with his wife, Happie Byers, to nurse his stepdaughter, Wendy, who was dying from cancer; and

WHEREAS: Charles and Happie, upon Wendy's death, decided to make their home here in order to care for Wendy's daughter, Jessica; and

WHEREAS: In his only 7 years of residency in the City of Cambridge Charles Moos made lasting contributions to the city and to many of the institutions which make this a great city; and

WHEREAS: Charles, whose distinguished career included service as an historian for the U.S. Army, as a Member of the War Labor Board during World War II, as Dave Garroway's personal assistant at NBC news, and as a corporate, domestic relations and entertainment lawyer, jumped with the enthusiasm into his new life in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Charles Moos served as President of the Harvard Institute for Learning in Retirement where he taught courses in de Toqueville, mediation theory, and constitutional law; and

WHEREAS: Charles Moos served as the treasurer of Primary Source, a nonprofit center which develops curriculum and trains teachers in inclusionary history and multi-cultural education; and

WHEREAS: Charles's passing will leave a void in the lives of all of his surviving friends and family, his wife Happie, his three sons John, Alan and Joel, their wives Connie and Anne, his grandchildren Jessie, Katie, Jonah and Jessica, and all the members of the Havura Or Haddash where he worshiped and shared his joy at his rediscovery of his Jewish faith; and

WHEREAS: Charles will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Charles J. Moos** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

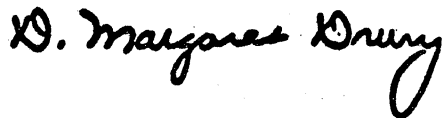
RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Moos family on behalf of the entire City Council.

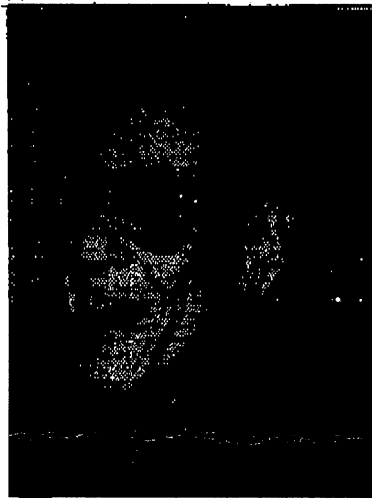

CHARLES J. MOOS

Charles J. Moos, 79

A retired attorney

A memorial service will be held today for Charles J. Moos, a retired attorney, who died Sept. 11 in his home in Cambridge. He was 79.

Mr. Moos was born in Jenkintown, Pa. He graduated from Harvard College and the University of Pennsylvania Law School.

During World War II, he was a mediator with the National War Labor Board and a historian with the Army. Following the war, he was a commissioner of conciliation with the US Department of Labor and an attorney with RCA and NBC before becoming a partner in the New York law firm of Fink, Weinberger, Levin & Gottechalk from 1960 until retiring in 1989.

After moving to Cambridge in 1990, he was a student and instructor at the Harvard Institute for Learning in Retirement.

He leaves his wife, Happie Byers; three sons, Alan of Guilford, Vt., John of Cambridge, and Joel of Brooklyn, N.Y.; a brother, Edward of Bryn Athyn, Pa.; and three grandchildren.

The memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. in the Friends Meeting House in Cambridge.
