Notice has been received of the death on October 23 of Captain Edward J. Welch, a member of the Police Department since 1893 it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of this sad event.

Captain Welch was born in Cambridge and resided here all his life, became a patrolman in 1893, was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 1911 and three years later was advanced to a Lieutenantcy. 1921 saw him wearing the escutcheon of a Captain, which rank he held at the time of his death.

During his leisure hours he was an active worker in the affairs of St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church, and the Knights of Columbus.

He had a wide circle of friends who may draw consolation from the fact that though he has passed from our midst the memory of his good influence will remain with us. It is
