WHEREAS:

The recent work of Captain John Canney and his squad of special officers, comprising Sergeant Joseph Shannon and Officers William Curtin and James D. Russell, has been generally recognized as one of the most efficient pieces of police work accomplished in Massachusetts in recent years, it having resulted in the recovery of some twenty-seven stolen cars from all parts of the country, the indictment of some forty-nine persons for larceny, conspiracy and for the receiving of stolen property, which number does not include the additional indictments asked for by the officers.

Therefore be it

ORDERED:

That Captain Canney, Sergeant Joseph Shannon and Officers William Curtin and James D. Russell be and hereby are commended by the City Council of the City of Cambridge for the conspicuous services they have rendered and, be it further

ORDERED:

That these officers be commended separately in the usual manner by the Chief of the Police Department of the City of Cambridge.
