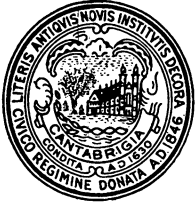
Question #2

The charitable and educational purposes of this Corporation are:

- To present quality literary works, primarily poetry, on a non-profit basis for the benefit of the general public;
- To further the education of the public by encouraging the writing, reading, and appreciation of quality poetry;
- To promote the equal rights of women in the literary field;
- To end discrimination against women in the publication of poetry;
- To encourage and support the publication of poetry of lesser known artists
- To engage only in charitable and educational activities permitted by Chapter 180 of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as limited by Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as it now exists and may hereafter be amended.

The corporation intends to achieve these purposes in the following charitable, educational, and literary ways:

- (1) By organizing poetry readings and workshops in the Boston area on a non-profit basis and for the benefit of the general public;
- (2) By conducting skill workshops to assist and encourage authors, particularly women authors interested in writing poetry;
- (3) By the selection and publication of quality political works for distribution to the general public;
- (4) By developing informational materials about the organization of poetry collectives;
- (5) By coordinating with both individuals and institutions of the academic and literary communities in the development, production and distribution of quality literary works;
- (6) By engaging in any and all charitable and educational activities permitted by Chapter 180 of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as limited by Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as it now exists, and may hereafter be amended.

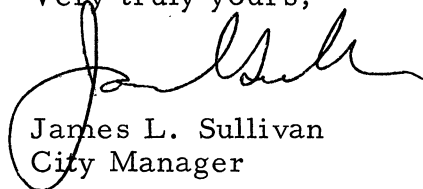
