RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Carol C. Connarton** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

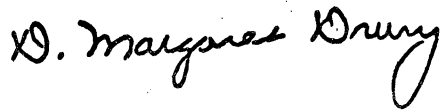
