VICE MAYOR REEVES

WHEREAS: It is of paramount concern to this City Council that the streets of Cambridge be free of the hazards caused by vehicles driven at an illegally high rate of speed; and

WHEREAS: Many towtrucks under contract to the city have been observed speeding on city streets, particularly on, but not confined to, Columbia Street, Garden Street, and New Street; and

WHEREAS: Speeding citations have been issued on various occasions to drivers of these towtrucks; and

WHEREAS: Towtruck operators under contract to the city have a particular obligation to see that their drivers operate their trucks at a safe and legal rate of speed; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to investigate this matter, and report back within two weeks on the possibility of amending any future contracts with towing companies to include an explicit provision that such contract be immediately suspended if the signatory towing company receive more than a set maximum number of speeding citations during the term of the contract.
