WHEREAS: On Friday, February 13, 1998 at 5 p.m., The Massachusetts Coalition of Battered Women Service Groups and the CambridgeSide Galleria will host a candlelight vigil to recognize the twenty-one victims who died as a result of domestic violence in Massachusetts in 1997; and

WHEREAS: A domestic violence survivor will light the first candle in their memory, and each candle will be lit, one by one, to be floated in the lagoon while opponents of such tragedies illuminate their own candles in a moment of silence; and

WHEREAS: The survivors and supporters who have organized this commemoration hope to demonstrate and emphasize that remembering is not enough – prevention is the only solution; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record expressing its appreciation to the Massachusetts Coalition of Battered Women Service Groups and the CambridgeSide Galleria for holding this important commemoration of the victims of domestic violence; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council further urges all Cantabrigians to be cognizant of this commemoration and to take this opportunity to support the elimination of domestic violence; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the The Massachusetts Coalition of Battered Women Service Groups and the CambridgeSide Galleria on behalf of the entire City Council.
