In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled: "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter 2, entitled: "Administration," Section 191, **List of Salaries in General** with amendments thereto is hereby further amended in said Section 191 by striking out the following:

City Manager: Minimum Annual Salary, \$31,000.00; Maximum Annual Salary, \$34,000.00 and Increment, \$1,000.00 and substituting in place thereof the following:

City Manager: Annual Salary, \$45,000.00. Said Ordinance to become effective upon passage.

In amendment to an Ordinance entitled: "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows: Article XXII, entitled: "Officers Generally," Section 2-191, List of Salaries in General is hereby amended by striking out said Section 2-191 and substituting in place thereof the following new section:

Section 2-191. List of Salaries in General.

The officers of the City of Cambridge hereinafter named, shall receive the following salaries and are to be paid monthly or weekly, unless otherwise stated. The effective date of Part One shall be July 1, 1973. The effective date of Part Two shall be July 1, 1974.

PART TWO.

Effective July 1, 1974, all positions described in Part One shall, if applicable, receive an additional wage increase computed as follows:

For the purpose of computing any such increase the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers - Greater Boston Area for January, 1973, shall be considered to be the base index. The increase, if any, shall be computed by subtracting the base index from the index for July, 1974. That difference shall then be multiplied by 100. That product will be divided by the base index. The division shall, if necessary, be carried to the nearest hundredth and then rounded off to the nearest tenth. Hundredths up to and including four hundredths shall be considered zero tenths and five hundredths and above shall be considered to be one-tenth for the purpose of rounding off.

All persons holding the above positions at the time of the passage of this ordinance shall receive their salaries then in effect plus the salary adjustment equivalent to 6 per cent of such salaries.

Persons appointed to these positions after the passage of this ordinance shall receive a minimum salary with an increment each year of their service until their maximum annual salary is reached.
