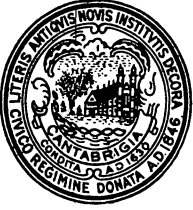

Dear Sir:

You have asked for my opinion whether Mrs. Charles W. Banks, widow of former Water Department employee, Charles W. Banks is eligible for an annuity under the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 32, Section 95A.

It is my understanding that Mr. Banks was employed by the Water Department from December 3, 1934 through September 3, 1959 at which time he received a disability pension under General Laws, Chapter 32, Section 57.

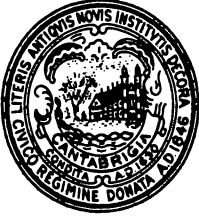
General Laws, Chapter 32, Section 101 provides that the widow of an employee who was receiving a disability pension pursuant to Chapter 32, Section 57 shall be paid an annual allowance in the amount of \$1,680.00.


