- WHEREAS: AIDS is a debilitating disease that has worldwide effects; and
- WHEREAS: The Harvard-Radcliffe AIDS Benefit Committee will be sponsoring a week-long AIDS benefit- "FESTIVAL OF LIFE- Seven Days for AIDS Research and Care" in February; and
- WHEREAS: The FESTIVAL OF LIFE will be a unique approach to combatting this illness, whereby the Harvard campus will devote its energies towards helping those with AIDS through seven days of special events and fundraisers that will include arts events, plays, concerts, an educational symposium and a full day of children's activities; and
- WHEREAS: The week will begin with a gala OVATIONS- Women United for AIDS Research and Care, which will be a star-studded major fundraiser held on the stage of the American Repertory Theatre on February 17; and
- WHEREAS: The FESTIVAL OF LIFE is intended to be a positive, constructive response to the current health crisis with people from diverse backgrounds working together to support the men, women and children who suffer from AIDS and its repercussions; and
- WHEREAS: The FESTIVAL OF LIFE has already received the support of Joan Kennedy and Radcliffe President Matina Horner as well as accomplished women in the arts including Colleen Dewhurst, Carmen de Lavallade, JoAnne Ahalaitis and Nancy Marchand; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record in support of the Harvard-Radcliffe AIDS benefit Committee's "FESTIVAL OF LIFE", and urge all citizens to take note of, and participate in, this worthy event.
