- WHEREAS:** In the short period of 3 years the Cambridge Housing Authority has not only developed and complied with an Affirmative Action Plan but is also to receive an award from the Regional Office of HUD commending the Authority for effective implementation and outstanding performance on Affirmative Action, and
- WHEREAS:** This citation is not only a credit to the Cambridge Housing Authority and its administration but also demonstrates that Affirmative Action can be achieved with proper planning and work and further is an attainable goal that can and should be met, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby ask this City Council to commend the Cambridge Housing Authority for their distinguished efforts and the demonstration of a goal which all public agencies should actively pursue.
