RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council shall proclaim Wednesday, October 5, 1995, "Transportation Awareness Day," urging all residents of the City of Cambridge to consider alternatives to the single occupant vehicle, as a method of preserving the healthy environment of our community and, by extension, our planet; and be it further
