

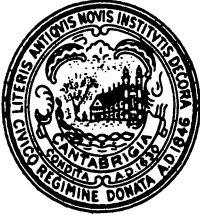



To the Honorable, the City Council:

The attached appropriation transfer, in the amount of \$1,400.00 has been requested by the Building Superintendent to reimburse his 1976-77 budget for the cost of razing a building at 79-81 Brookline Street. In September, 1976, the City's Board of Survey declared that an "emergency" situation existed at 79-81 Brookline Street and ordered the Building Superintendent to raze the building immediately. The cost of razing the structure, \$2,400.00 turned out to be \$1,400.00 more than was budgeted for this purpose. Therefore, a transfer of \$1,400.00 is required at this time to allow the Building Superintendent to complete the fiscal year without over-expending his budget.

Passage of the attached order is recommended.
