VICE MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: Projected shortfalls in State revenue, and thus reduced local aid and support for State programs serving Cambridge citizens, will have an immense impact on Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Officials of cities and towns around the Commonwealth are experiencing substantial concerns about the future of municipal services and schools; and
- WHEREAS: The ability of the City to rely on increased State aid to serve its needs since proposition 2 1/2 has masked the need for broader changes in the State tax structure; and
- WHEREAS: This need has again resurfaced as a result of the State budget crisis, and
- WHEREAS: The Tax Equity Alliance for Massachusetts has been developed to work toward fundamental changes in the tax structure and is reaching out now to communities around the state to educate citizens and officials about taxes; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to set a hearing time at the April 3, 1989 City Council Meeting to hear from a representative of the Tax Equity Alliance for Massachusetts, on issues related to State tax restructuring, particularly with regard to benefits for the City of Cambridge and State services to its citizens.
