Rev. Arthur J. Metaxas, retired Orthodox pastor

The Rev. Dr. Arthur J. Metaxas of Newton, retired pastor of St. Athanasius Greek Orthodox Church, died Tuesday in St. John of God Hospital in Allston. He was 75.

Born in Danielson, Conn., Rev. Metaxas graduated from Holy Cross Theological Seminary in Brookline in 1947.

He later earned a divinity degree, a master's in pastoral counseling and a doctorate in ministry from Andover Newton Theological Seminary in Newton.

Rev. Metaxas was pastor of St. Athanasius Greek Orthodox Church in Arlington, retiring in 1989.

He was a former pastor of St. Constantine and St. Helen's in Cambridge from 1951 to 1977.

Rev. Metaxas was an orthodox chaplain at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the former state prison in Charlestown, the state prison in Walpole and the Cambridge Police Department.

He taught modern Greek at Cambridge High and Latin School, was a member of the Cambridge Civic Unity Com-

mittee, the Holy Cross Alumni Association, the New England Clergymen's Association and the Minuteman Chapter of AHEPA, for which he was chaplain.
