- WHEREAS: John as served as a Combat Veteran of World War II in all combat areas, Naval Officer; Brigadier General, Massachusetts State Guard; Commander of the 5th Brigade, Lexington Armory; Bicentennial Commanding Officer of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company quartered at Faneuil Hall; and escorted the Queen of England on her visit to Boston on July 6, 1976, and
- WHEREAS: John has served as Past Commander of Post 27 American Legion and Past Exalted Ruler of Cambridge Lodge of Elks, and
- WHEREAS: John has received an award from the city of Rio de Janeiro and the Brazilian Government in 1976, and
- WHEREAS: John is a Fellow of Boston College Law School and former counsel to the Massachusetts Legislature on Redistricting, now therefore be it;
