In Common Council, Feb. 25, 1863.

The Joint Standing Committee on Ordinances, to which was referred so much of the Address of his Honor, the Mayor, as relates to the revision and publication of the City Ordinances, has considered the subject and would respectfully

Report: That a revision of the Ordinances of the City is desirable, but is less necessary at the present time, from the fact that such Ordinances as have been passed since January 20, 1859, were printed during the last year, in pursuance of an Order of the City Council adopted April 30, 1862, with an index to facilitate a reference to them.

In view of the expense of the proposed revision and publication, and of the other and extraordinary expenses of the present year, the Committee recommends a postponement of any further action upon the subject at the present time.
