- WHEREAS: The drop-off recycling program has meet with interest and increasing success in the city; and
- WHEREAS: It seems that the State program is further and further off into the future; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge program has gathered the interest of an active committee of volunteers; and
- WHEREAS: It is also understood that there are some difficult issues around disposal of newspapers because the supply of recyclable material has outstripped the processing capability of the recycling industry; and
- WHEREAS: There is great potential to support environmental concerns and save money in the long run; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby it requested to work with the recycling committee to develop a pick-up program for a neighborhood to become a model for an eventual city-wide pick-up program; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the City Council on the details of the program as it is developed.
