WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Leonard Wheeler a member of the law firm of Goodwin, Proctor and Hoar for nearly fifty years; and

WHEREAS: Leonard, born in Worcester, graduated from Harvard College and Harvard Law School, where he was Law Review Editor for two years; and

WHEREAS: Leonard served during World War II in the Army Signal Corps and as an assistant prosecutor at the Huremberg War trials; and

WHEREAS: Leonard was a member and eventually a partner in the law firm of Goodwin, Proctor, where he worked from 1925 until his retirement in 1970; and

WHEREAS: Leonard was a past president of the Cambridge Bar Association of Cambridge Family and Children Services from 1946 until 1968, a director of the Cambridge Council of Boy Scouts of America and the International Student Association of Greater Boston; and

WHEREAS: Leonard was a member of the Master Works Chorale, the Lexington Choral Society and an organizer of the Chocorua Lake Association and the Chocorua Lake Conservation Foundation in New Hampshire; and

WHEREAS: Leonard's passing will leave a void in the lives of all of his surviving family, his wife, former Cambridge City Councillor, Cornelia; his sons, Leonard, Jr. and John B.; his daughters Cornelia Lanou and Penelope Pi-Sunyer; his thirteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS: Leonard will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Leonard Wheeler at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
