Judge Jeremiah J. Sullivan served as a member of the Cambridge City Council from 1936 to 1940 and a member of the Great and General Court of the Commonwealth from 1940 to 1952, during which time Judge Sullivan compiled an outstanding record as a State Representative, and

While serving his constituents in a most admired fashion Judge Sullivan was still available as a practicing attorney always being recognized for his fairness and generosity and his high sense of devotion to the interests of his clients, and

WHEREAS:

In 1952 the late great Governor of the Commonwealth Paul A. Dever acknowledged these tremendous characteristics and appointed Jeremiah J. Sullivan to the Probate Bench, therefore be it
