ORDERED:

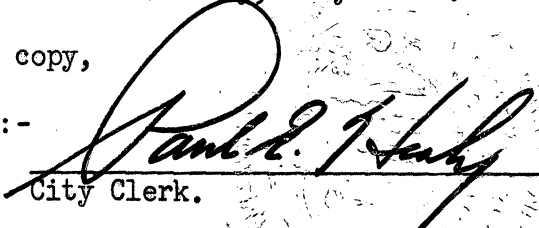

That we, County of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts, as Principal, and MARYLAND CASUALTY COMPANY, a Corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Maryland and having an usual place of business in Boston, Massachusetts, as Surety, are holden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto the CITY OF CAMBRIDGE, in said Commonwealth, in the full and just sum of FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS lawful money of the United States of America, to the payment of which sum, well and truly to be made, we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, jointly and severally firmly by these presents,

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH THAT

WHEREAS, by an order of the City Council under date of October 11, 1965, the Commissioner of Public Works was authorized to grant a permit to County of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts for a steampipe trench running 57 feet along Third St. from corner of Thorndike St., approximately 3 feet out from curb, also a trench on Jail side of Thorndike St., running from Second Street to Third Street, Cambridge, Mass., approximate distance 215 feet.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the said County of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts shall faithfully observe and keep each and all the agreements, stipulations, conditions specifications and provisions on its part to be kept and performed contained in said permit and in each and every extension of the same; according to the full extent and spirit of said permit and the ordinances of the said City now relating or that may relate thereto, and shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Cambridge from all liabilities, damages, judgments, loss and expenses whatsoever which the City may incur or suffer, arising out of the issuing of such permit and all extensions of the same, and from the construction, maintenance or operation of said Steampipe Trench and shall make no default therein, then this obligation shall be null and void; otherwise it shall be and remain in full force and effect.
