SUBJECT: Attached City Council Order, the Transportation of
(L. N. G.) Liquid Natural Gas.

Sir:

On June 19, 1979, I spoke to Captain Harrington of the Cambridge Fire Department, (Fire Prevention Unit) who stated that a recent study was conducted by this Unit in (under the command of Deputy Chief Gelinas) April. At that time the study indicated trucks carrying Liquified Natural Gas did not enter the City of Cambridge.

On June 20, 1979, I spoke to Mr. Rod Twedell, Supervisor of Distrigas Distributor, Everett Marine Terminal, 18 Rover St., Everett, Mass. Mr. Twedell stated that all L. N. G. trucks are routed to specified routes, outside the City of Cambridge, distribution centers (no distribution centers in Cambridge).

In the event, that some time in the future, L. N. G. trucks are to enter Cambridge, the safest and most expedient route can and should be so designated.

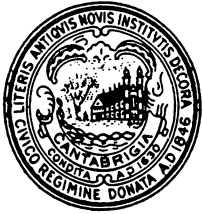

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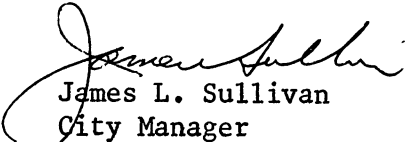
