WHEREAS: This time is set aside annually to emphasize and highlight awareness of the caution and protective measures necessary to prevent inflammable incidents; and

WHEREAS: The kickoff for the week long celebration will commence on Sunday, October 4, 1992 at 11:30 a.m. with a parade starting at the fire house, 173 Cambridge Street and concluding at Cambridgeside Galleria; and

WHEREAS: On October 4, 1992 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, an Open House will be held at all fire stations where safety pamphlets, smoke detector and public safety information concerning the Fire Department will be available; and

WHEREAS: At 4:00 p.m. on October 5, 1992 the Cambridge Housing Authority will announce nine winners of it's poster contest, designed around the theme of fire safety; and

WHEREAS: October 1992 marks the 8th consecutive year of the presentation of a comprehensive Fire Safety Program at the Cambridge schools, utilizing the theme LEARN NOT TO BURN - TEST YOUR DETECTOR... IT'S SOUND ADVICE; and

WHEREAS: Each child will receive an official Cambridge Fire Department Smoke Detector Inspector's Badge, a fire helmet and a special reward for inspecting their home detectors; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council urges all citizens of the City of Cambridge to participate in some manner to the success of Fire Prevention Week and to take advantage of this opportune and enlightening period to familiarize themselves with the various methods of avoiding the onset of fires.

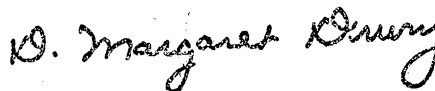
