- worked for the City of Cambridge Water Department for 12 years during which time he and Joan had five children, four boys and a girl
- became involved with Cambridge Youth Hockey program as coach for 10 years and President of organization for five years
- went to work for Middlesex County in District Court as a Court Officer for five years before being promoted to Superior Court
- was in charge of all sequestered juries
- promoted to Grand Jury Officer
- put in a total of 22 years for Middlesex County
- after 57 years of living in Cambridge, is retiring with wife Joan to Lyman, Maine

WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Paul Boudreau, a life long Cantabrigian and veteran Middlesex County Court Officer will soon retire from active duty; and

WHEREAS: Paul attended local public schools graduating from the former Cambridge High and Latin School in 1947 and served his country as a member of the United States Air Force and upon being honorably discharged worked for actor and famous author Harold Russell as his Assistant in the Washington Office; and

WHEREAS: Prior to joining the Middlesex County Court system Paul was employed in the Water Department of the City of Cambridge, a position he held for twelve years until he went to the County, first as a Court Officer assigned to District Court and later assigned to Superior Court where he was placed in charge of all sequestered juries and later was promoted to his current position of Grand Jury Officer; and

WHEREAS: Paul has long been active in sporting activities, serving as Coach in the Cambridge Youth Hockey Program for ten years and as President of the organization for five years, a position from which he demonstrated leadership and a keen ability to get along with parents and children; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation and gratitude to Grand Jury Officer Paul Boudreau for his dedication to the people and the court system of Middlesex County and to further extend to him, his wife, Joan, and their five children every good wish for continued good health and happiness in the years ahead; and be it further
