COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: It is has been reported in the news media that the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare, Joseph A. Califano, Jr., that the U.S. Government is spending \$40,000,000. over a five year period to spray highly toxic Herbicide on marijuana fields in Mexico, and
- WHEREAS: There is danger that Mexican marijuana containing Herbicide residue may find its way into our New England region, which includes Cambridge, and
- WHEREAS: It has been declared by the National Institute on Drug Abuse that irreversable lung damage could result from smoking contaminated marijuana, therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Commissioner of Health and Hospitals for the City of Cambridge be requested to make analysis of all drugs confiscated by the Police Department to determine and accurately assess the scope and nature of the dangers posed to the citizens of Cambridge, and make their findings to the City Council.
