- WHEREAS: L.I.F.E. seeks to end the isolation of nursing home residents by showing the world the valuable contributions still to be made by the elderly and to return dignity to old age by working for adequate income, dignified living situations, and enriching recreational activities, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Thomas W. Danehy, Mayor of Cambridge, declare June 2, 1979 "A Living for the Elderly Day" in Cambridge, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to the Cambridge Chapter Co-Presidents Katherine Doutney and John Thayer.
