WHEREAS: The current owners of the property numbered and known as 42 Cogswell Avenue have petitioned this City to rename that section of Cogswell Avenue as Cogswell Court and to assign unit numbers designating their individual properties; and

WHEREAS: This City Council is in receipt of a communication dated October 8, 1985 from the City Engineer indicating that this portion of Cogswell Avenue should be designated and known as a private common driveway consistent with established guidelines for the naming of private ways and recommended that the City Council recognize Cogswell Court as a private way within the City of Cambridge; therefore be it

ORDERED: That this City Council go on record renaming the premises located at 42 Cogswell Avenue as Cogswell Court and that the the individual housing units be assigned as street addresses; and be it further

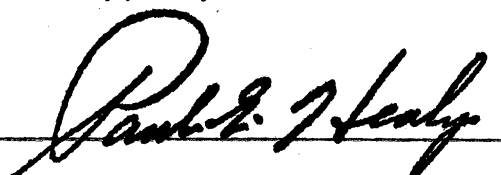

In response to your request for recommendations concerning the above referenced petition, please be advised of the following.

The wording of the petition is mis-leading. This Office would not recommend the renaming of any section of Cogswell Avenue, as requested in the petition (see petition).

However, this Office has no objection to the naming of a common driveway located at 42 Cogswell Avenue to Cogswell Court, and the assignment of unit numbers as street addresses along Cogswell Court. The naming of this common driveway to Cogswell Court is consistent with established guidelines for the naming of private way, and does not conflict with existing street names. I would therefore recommend that the City Council officially recognize Cogswell Court as a private way within the City of Cambridge.
