Cambridgeport November 10th 1863

City of Cambridge

The undersigned, Owners & Occupants of
Estates situated on Hancock Street, West of Main Street
respectfully represent, said Street was laid out and used
as such, previous to August 26, 1851. the date of Ordinance re-
quiring Streets accepted, to be forty feet in width - said Street
has not only been a public highway, but has been, previous
to - and ever since the passage of said Ordinance, used by the
City for a Common Sewer.

Your petitioners would request the acceptance
of said Street, under the Amendment to above Ordinance,
lately passed by the City Council, prohibiting the acceptance
of Streets less than forty feet wide, laid out since the passage
of first named Ordinance August 26, 1851.
