When the boiler was dismantled and removed, this department was never notified by Heating Company. Our first involvement was Aug. 29, 1988, when C & M Environment (Asbestos Abatement Co.) applied for a permit.

I visited the site on Aug. 30, 1988, at which time Mr. Dave Madden from DEQE had already ordered contractor to correct violations. I made subsequent visits on Sept. 7, 14, 16, & 20th. On Sept. 20, 1988, all areas were approved by Mr. Madden after all air and wipe test were received.

To the best of knowledge, the Attorney representing the tenants received all test taken by the owner, the contractor and their own testing co.

Since then, I ordered another test taken after the laundry room equipment was removed and replaced by new equipment. While empty the room was again scrubbed down and repainted.

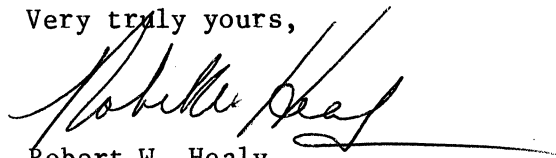
