March 31, 1980

- WHEREAS: Cambridge voters in the November 6, 1979 City election overwhelmingly approved, by a 4 to 1 vote, Question 3, which in part advised this City Council "to request the state and federal governments not to license the construction or operation of any new nuclear power plants"; and
- WHEREAS: Continued uncertainties as to the safety and health risks of nuclear power plants and all stages of the nuclear fuel cycle make it inadvisable for our nation to continue investment in this unpredictable technology; and
- WHEREAS: These concerns have been highlighted by the accident at Three Mile Island and by numerous lesser incidents since then; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Council of the City of Cambridge herewith requests the state and federal governments not to license the construction or operation of any new nuclear power plants; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this request be formally transmitted to the President of the United States, the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the two Senators in Congress from Massachusetts, the Representative in Congress from the Eighth Massachusetts Congressional District, and the Cambridge delegation to the General Court.
