Estates benefitted to be assessed according to law.

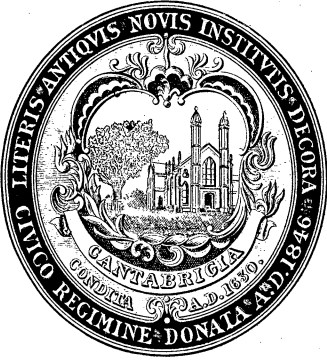

Honorable the City Council of the
City of Cambridge:-

I am returning herewith without my approval an order adopted by your Honorable Board on September 18th, 1917, for the construction of sewers in Inman street and in Cottage Park Avenue.

The City Engineer informs me that the construction of a sewer for surface drainage in Cottage Park Avenue is impossible, owing to the low elevation of the street.

I am also not approving of the order for Inman street at the present time, since it involves consideration of the engineering problems presented by the unusual size and number of pipes, and the sewer already in the street.

The Engineer informs me that the expense for this construction would represent a much larger sum of money than similar construction would cost elsewhere, and that we have no appropriation available for this purpose. Also the construction of such a sewer would fail to bring the relief desired.

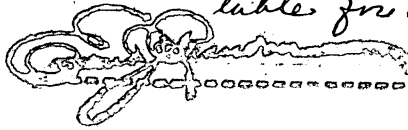
For these reasons I am withholding my approval from this order.

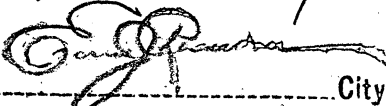
