I am writing on behalf of the Harvest Co-operative Supermarket in Central Square and the Central Square neighborhood to request that two bicycle racks be installed in the Norfolk Street parking lot #5 along with another rack for the Essex Street city parking lot #4 and one for the Essex Street T exit. The present lack of bicycle racks and the poor design of the one we currently have, forces our members and customers to attempt to secure their bicycles to trees, parking meters, street signs, as well as to our building. 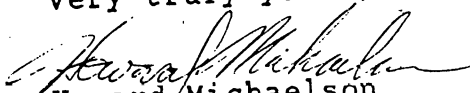
