The undersigned would respectfully petition your Honorable Board, for the privilege of encumbering Brewery Street, while relaying our railroad track which runs across said street. Also for the privilege of so altering the grade on westerly side of said street, as to make it of uniform height with easterly side; as in duty bound we ever pray.

We would say in regard to the change of grade that the track on easterly side of street is some four or five inches higher than on westerly side, and all we desire is to make track level and grade uniform, getting rid at same time of any decayed sleepers or planking which may be found in the present track. Should the Boston & Albany tracklayers do the work, as they probably will, the detention to travel will be merely nominal.
