- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the passing of Louis N. Fougere on November 2, 1981, at the age of eighty-five years; and
- WHEREAS: Louis N. Fougere was a native of New Brunswick, Canada who was appointed to the Cambridge School Department in 1924 as a Teacher of Mathematics at Cambridge High and Latin School, where his outstanding talents led to his promotion as the first Master of the Fitzgerald School in North Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Louis N. Fougere was a 1915 graduate of Boston College High School and received his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from Little Rock College in 1922 and 1923, respectively; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Fougere imparted his love for mathematics to a generation of students who, inspired by his warmth and enthusiasm, achieved new honors at College Level and embarked on successful careers in the world of finance, engineering and business; and
- WHEREAS: Louis N. Fougere will always be remembered by his students who were privileged to engage him in checker games during recess periods, which made his homeroom a place of joy and provided a departure from academic boredom; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sympathy to Mrs. Helen V. Fougere and her family at this time of great personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Fougere on behalf of the entire City Council to record our admiration for this outstanding person who represented the best in public service.

- WHEREAS: Louis graduated from Boston College High School in 1915 and went on to obtain a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from Little Rock College in 1922 and 1923 respectively; now therefore be it
