- WHEREAS: This City Council was saddened to learn of the death of Dr. Jean A. Curran, former acting Commissioner of Health and Hospitals, and a member of the Hospital Board, and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Curran was born in 1893 in Ironwood, Michigan and received an AB degree in Biology from Carleton College, Minnesota prior to attending Harvard Medical School, and
- WHEREAS: Upon his completion of medical school, Dr. Curran and his wife, the former Frances Rose left the United States to run a small medical mission for some 5 years, and
- WHEREAS: During the early 1930's he practiced medicine in New York City and also undertook what became a three-year study of internships and residencies available at New York hospitals; a study which later became a book, and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Curran was appointed acting Health Commissioner on April 1, 1967 by former City Manager Joseph A. DeGuglielmo, a position he held until November 15, 1967 when the City Manager had an opportunity to appoint a permanent Commissioner, and
- WHEREAS: This man always gave of himself and his talents with dedication and integrity, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere sympathies to the family of Dr. Jean A. Curran, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a copy of this resolution to Dr. Curran's family as an expression of our sorrow.
