Ordered,

That the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) be and hereby is appropriated for the construction of sewers for sanitary purposes and for sewage disposal as authorized by Section 5 (1), Chapter 719, Acts of the Year 1913

and it is further

Ordered

That a City Debt be Created

for the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000)
for the purpose of constructing sewers for sanitary purposes and for sewage disposal as authorized by Section 5 (1), Chapter 719, Acts of the Year 1913

and from time to time as the City Treasurer may deem necessary bonds of the City will be issued not exceeding that amount, either in the form of registered or coupon bonds, one or both, to be styled

SEWER CONSTRUCTION LOAN

said ~~loan~~ loan to be payable in accordance with the provisions of Section 14, Chapter 719, Acts of the Year 1913, so that the whole loan shall be paid in not more than thirty years from the date of the first bond issued or at such earlier dates as the City Treasurer, Mayor and City Auditor may determine

with interest at the rate of not exceeding $5\frac{1}{2}$ per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; that the Mayor, City Auditor and City Treasurer be and are hereby authorized and instructed to sign and execute said bonds and all transfers and exchanges of the same in the manner directed by the ordinances of the City, and that the City Treasurer be and is hereby directed to bargain and sell, and is hereby authorized to transfer and exchange the same.

I wish to call your attention to the condition of the appropriation for "Sewer General Construction". There was appropriated for this account an unexpended balance for 1919-1920 of \$8,517.62 and an additional appropriation of \$30,000., making a total appropriation of \$38,517.62. There has been expended to September 1, 1920, the sum of \$31,075.59.

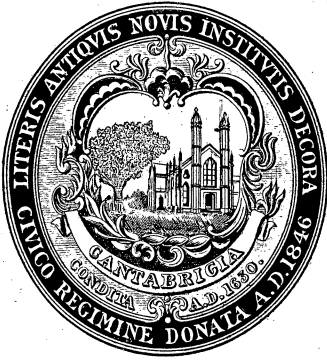
At the present rate of expenditures, this balance will be expended about October 1st, so that if it is proposed to carry on the construction work, additional appropriation will have to be made before that time.

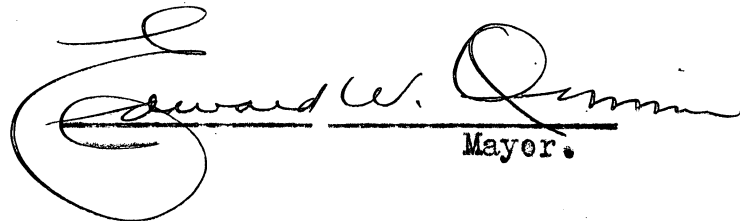
