WHEREAS: In addition to serving as president of the Board of Trustees at Cambridge Hospital during the 1950s, a fellow of the Fogg Art Museum at Harvard University, a member of the Ladies Committee of the Museum of Fine Arts, a longtime director of the Eastern Charitable Foundation, for 30 years, under the auspices of the Catholic Guild for the Blind, she found time to read to blind college and law school students; and

WHEREAS: She excelled as an artist with a special expertise in stained glass sculptures, and, most recently in 1987, displayed her ability as an amateur golfer by winning the City of Cambridge Senior Ladies Tournament; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Council expresses public appreciation for the life of Claire Hyman Steinert Thorn and conveys sympathy to her husband, Dr. George W. Thorn, her three children, Susan Poverman of Ossining, N.Y., Audrey Barnett of New Orleans and Alan Steinert Jr. of Cambridge, her stepson, Weston Thorn of New York, her grandchildren and great-grandchildren in their hour of loss; and be it further
