

Hospital links EMTs to emergency clinic

The Cambridge Hospital (TCH), recently came on-line with Radio Control access enabling paramedics and emergency medical technicians (EMTs), to maintain radio contact with physicians in the hospital's Emergency Department. In many cases this immediate medical treatment via radio has saved the lives of individuals who would have died prior to reaching the Emergency Department.

According to Dr. John T. Nagurny, medical director of the Cambridge Hospital Emergency Department, the hospital receives about 50-80 radio control calls each month. "Participation in the pre-hospital care system extends the extension of the physician in the streets, workplace and homes," says Nagurny.

There is a three step procedure which occurs when radio control is accessed. This includes: identification of the paramedic unit in the area, an assurance that the radio is working properly, a description of the case, and communication with the physician for proper treatment procedures.

Cambridge Hospital went on-line with Radio Control Access in October 1987, and handles calls jointly with Mt. Auburn Hospital, which went on-line over a year ago. The two hospitals respond to calls according to geographic area. TCH is responsible for all emergency calls in Cambridge and Somerville, east of Harvard Square. The two hospitals have collectively responded to over 4,000 control calls since they began.

The number of responses though, is much higher than the number of actual transports. Although exact figures are not yet available, many lives have been saved by EMTs and paramedics. It would take eight to ten minutes to take a patient to the hospital without pre-hospital care, according to Tony Fucaloro, Administrative Director of The South

Middlesex Emergency Medical Services Consortium (SMEMS). The consortium oversees Radio Control Access for its five member hospitals: The Cambridge Hospital, Mt. Auburn Hospital, Santa Maria St. Elizabeth's Hospital.

The SMEMS, provides emergency care through the Advanced Life Support System (ALS) and Basic Life Support System (BLS). ALS relies primarily on paramedics who are literally translates to by the physician's, whose medical training includes intubating (insertion of a tube into the patient's throat to facilitate breathing), defibrillation, insertion of I.V.'s, assessments and administration of medications.

Chamber forum on sexual harassment held

The Cambridge Chamber of Commerce, in conjunction with the Cambridge Combined Business Association, launched its 1988 program year with a seminar on Sexual Harassment in the workplace January 19 and a new member orientation breakfast, January 27.

The first in a series of the Chamber's informational programs, the sexual harassment seminar was designed to update Chamber members on current legal issues regarding sexual harassment and on contractual obligations relating to sexual harassment.

Hosted by Carl Barron, chairman of the Cambridge Combined Business Association, the seminar featured labor relations expert and attorney Jason Berger, senior partner of the law firm of Peabody & Brown.

Berger discussed both the federal and state laws on sexual harassment, the recent law changes and the business procedures used to protect the business and employer. He discussed recent court cases on contractual obligations that result from employee handbooks.

The Chamber has prepared a sum-

mary of major points taken in the seminar including what to do when reviewing employer programs, employee agreement and oral promises. The summary also outlines a brief explanation federal and state sexual harassment laws with summaries of the cases Berger presented.

Notes are available from the Chamber upon request. The Chamber's second new member orientation breakfast provided a forum for new and old members to get better acquainted. New members had a chance to introduce themselves and their business while learning about the Chamber, its services and activities.

Casework head speaks to Red Cross board

On Tuesday, February 2, Miriam Barrett, Director of Casework Services for American Red Cross of Massachusetts Bay, spoke to the Board of Directors of the Cambridge Region. Casework Specialists work with disaster victims through the recovery process with such assistance as counseling, material needs, and job recommendations of the housing task force, the department hopes to add a housing specialist who would have current knowledge of available housing through close contact with public and real estate agents in order to

relocate disaster victims more expeditiously. Barrett also outlined expanding efforts to help veterans with the forms required for accurate judgment of benefit availability as well as counseling for case hearings on discharge status. Barrett is evaluating how Red Cross volunteers may provide support to Veterans Administration outreach workers so that they may spend more time in the field to help homeless veterans. Caseworkers also provide service to military families, such as counseling, emergency transportation and assistance for travel. The presentation concluded with a film, "At Home Around the World."

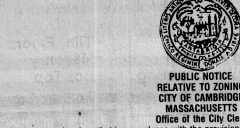

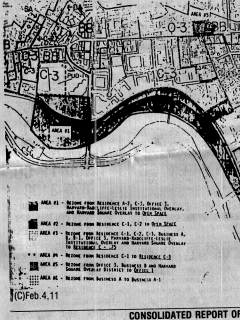

In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge."

That Chapter 10 entitled "Administration" Article 10B entitled "Department of Public Works" be hereby amended by striking out section 2-133 entitled "Board of Assessors; Appointments; Term; Vacancies" and substituting in lieu thereof a new section 2-133 which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 10B. ASSESSORS DEPARTMENT

Section 2-133. Board of Assessors; Appointments; Term; Vacancies.

(a) The Assessors Department shall be under the chairmanship of the Board of Assessors who shall be known as the Board of Assessment.

The Chairman of the Board of Assessors/Director of Assessment shall be appointed by and shall be set by the City Manager. The Director shall serve as the Department Head. The Assessors Department shall be known as the Department of Public Works.

(b) There shall be three (3) Assessors, including the Chairman, to be appointed by the City Manager for terms of three (3) years; such appointments to be made on a staggered basis so that one appointment for each appointment shall commence on the First Monday in January following the year which occurs at any time on the Board of Assessors, including the Chairman/Director of the City Manager, shall be appointed by the City Manager.

(c) The Director and Assessors shall have all the powers and duties of assessors as set forth in the laws of the Commonwealth, and shall devote full time to the duties.

AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an Ordinance formerly entitled "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter Sixteen entitled "Public Transportation" is hereby amended by adding the following sections:

Section 16-45. Seizure.

Where a vehicle operator required to be licensed by this chapter picks up a person or property in Cambridge without such a license, in the presence of a police officer, said police officer may impound the vehicle, and any taximeter within said vehicle, used by said operator in violating the provisions of this chapter.

Section 16-46. Arrest.

Where a vehicle operator required to be licensed by this chapter picks up a person or property in Cambridge without such a license in the presence of a police officer, said police officer may arrest said operator.

Section 16-47. General Penalties.

(a) Where a person is required to be licensed under this chapter and picks up a person or property in Cambridge without a license, said person shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for each violation.

(b) Where a person receiving requests for transportation for hire is required to be licensed under this chapter and operates without such a license said person shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for each violation.

(c) Any person operating in a joint enterprise with one who violates a provision of this chapter shall also be subject to a fine not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for each violation.

Section 16-48 Reciprocity.

This amendment shall only apply to vehicles licensed in a municipality other than Cambridge which specifically authorizes by ordinance or by-law the arrest of persons violating a cab-related licensing law and the seizure of taxis or a taximeter in conjunction with a violation of a cab-related licensing law.

This act shall take effect upon its passage.
