Plans of the proposed work may be seen at this office.

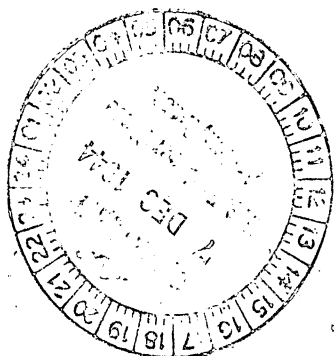
You are advised that it is your privilege to enter protest, from

fice on or before 11 December 1944.

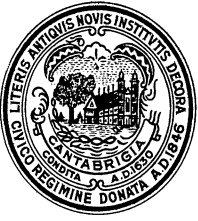
