I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the State Department of Mental Health for \$845,666 to the Health and Hospital Services Salary & Wages Account (\$743,377) and Other Ordinary Maintenance Account (\$102,289) to provide funds for a four-year psychiatric residency program which emphasizes basic psychiatric principles throughout a comprehensive curriculum. Training is provided in such areas as forensic administration, community and geriatric psychiatry, substance abuse, psychopharmacology, and crisis intervention.
