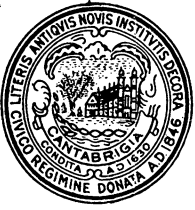
1. Counseling:

To help these youth find and direct their potentials. Encouraging them to pursue their leadership by working with other youth, with their combined knowledge of working together in their own constructive endeavors.

2. Promoting Interlocking Programs:

Programs that may not necessarily be sponsored by this organization but may make possible our youth getting involved with other youth (regardless of race, color or sex) in progressively-related movements.

C. The major concentration of Juvenile Potentiality is to steer youthful minds into a creative and guidably mature aim. With this guidance, hopefully, but reasonably, wanton delinquency and criminality can be reduced greatly in these areas.
