WHEREAS: The Committee on Finance of this City Council has reported that it is their opinion that the new Gerry's Landing ^{Bath} ~~Boat~~ House, built by the Metropolitan District Commission, should be maintained by said Commission; and

WHEREAS: Their report has been adopted unanimously by this body; and

WHEREAS: There has been introduced into the Massachusetts House of Representatives a bill asking that the Metropolitan District Commission be charged with the supervision of the said Gerry's Landing ^{Bath} ~~Boat~~ House, so that no part of the expense of maintaining the same will fall on the City of Cambridge.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that this City Council go on record as being unanimously in favor of the said bill introduced into the Massachusetts Legislature; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that copies of this resolve be sent to the Committees on Metropolitan affairs and on Ways and Means of the Massachusetts Legislature.

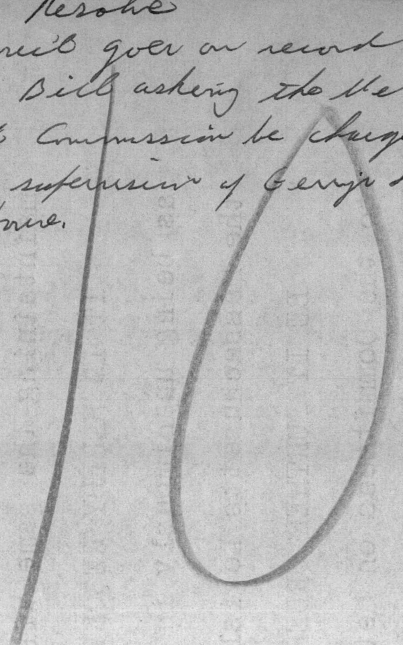
