Ellen M. Carmody, 95

Former Boston Globe secretary

Ellen Margaret Carmody, former secretary to the publisher of The Boston Globe, died Saturday at the Little Sisters of the Poor Retirement Home in Somerville. She was 95.

Miss Carmody was known as "Helen." She was a lifelong resident of Somerville.

She was hired by the Globe in 1926, in part because she was a great speller and had a fine writing hand, a skill much in demand in those days. She was secretary to Charles H. Taylor Jr., then went to work for publisher William O. Taylor and his son, William Davis Taylor, until April 1968, when she took early retirement due to failing health.

She leaves a cousin, Marie MacArthur of New Hampshire.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10:30 a.m. Thursday in the chapel of the Little Sisters home. Burial will be in St. James Cemetery in Haverhill.
