COUNCILLOR GRAHAM

ORDERED:

Following his recent visit to the United States by Prime Minister Turgut Ozal, we call upon the appropriate officials of Turkey, as a gesture of good will toward the people of Cambridge, Massachusetts and the peoples of democratic nations everywhere, to seek the immediate release of Mrs. Reha Isvan and other members of the Turkish Peace Association. We believe they are "prisoners of conscience," imprisoned in violation of their basic human rights, for their indictments do not charge, nor is there any evidence of violent activity of any kind. They are therefore suffering for the expression of their opinions, a right essential to democracy, and guaranteed by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, of which Turkey is a signatory.

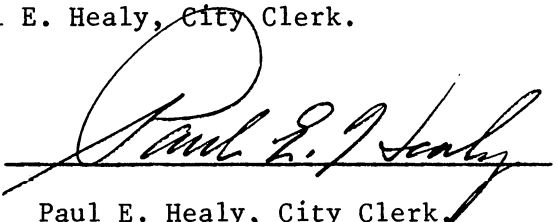
