

Cambridgeport, April 22nd 1869.

To His Honor Mayor Saunders,
(and the Common Council:

Sirs -

A meeting of the board took place last evening, the subject being the contemplated widening of Main St. on its northerly side, and in which a hearing would be had of parties interested. As I was unable to attend, I take this method of presenting my views on the subject, and the facts in the case, which are simply these - My estate is far from being abundantly supplied with land in the rear, and by taking the whole of the land in front, as is now proposed by the City, would cause a great decrease in the depth of my lot, and a consequent depreciation in the value of the remainder; besides this, and not unworthy of consideration, is the fact that I have recently built a fence, (an expensive one,) around the entire front, and which would have to be subjected ^{to removal,} and therefor a total loss. In short, the contemplated change would be detrimental to my estate, as could not fail to be perceived by any impartial mind; and I will simply add that I shall demand that remuneration which the consideration of these facts would justify.
